Let Your Words Be Gracious

"Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone" (Colossians 4:6)

Words are powerful. They can lift and they can crush. They can encourage and they can discourage. They have the ability to bring out the best in us or the worst in us. They are like arrows thrust into the hearts of those who hear us. And they are the soothing balm of compassionate love.

Remember the old adage, *"Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words can never hurt me?"* That's rather silly, don't you think? I like some other versions better: *"Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words can break my heart!"* Perhaps the following is more to the point:

*Sticks and stones are hard on bones,

Gracious words are filled with beauty and kindness. They are heart-warming and cleansing. They have the power to bring comfort to those who feel defeated and joy to those who are depressed. Scripture tells us that Jesus spoke words of grace and beauty. No wonder the crowds wanted to hear Him; no wonder the outcasts came and sat at His feet. And His words are still gracious today. They are redemptive and healing...and they are life.
